

## Federal Poverty Income Guidelines

FPIG's are figures issued by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and are used to establish eligibility for a variety, but not all, public assistance programs. These figures are revised annually based on changes in the Consumer Price Index. 2015 FPIG percentages used for various programs are as follows:
